Barung Landcare's Wootha Prize

Set in the Queensland Sunshine Coast Hinterland, the Wootha Prize is a national woodworking competition celebrating outstanding artistic excellence in timber. Extending beyond an artisan award, it fosters deeper connections with Australia's unique environment and Indigenous culture.

Hosted by Barung Landcare, the prize attracts contemporary designers and craftspeople from across Australia and celebrates the sustainable use of native timbers, following the competition's ethos: "Sustainable by Nature, Beautiful by Design."

Category prizes include:

- Furniture
- Sculpture
- Tiny Treasures
- and the William Bayliss Commemorative Prize, valued at \$10,000.

You will learn about timber grain and direction, knife safety, knife sharpening, tips on technique and how to finish your work to perfection. The class is small and all the tools are provided, along with expert tuition by Danny Holmes from Mudjimba Woodcraft.

Stool Making Workshop

In this immersive workshop, you'll be guided step by step through the process of making a milking stool from raw timber to finished piece. 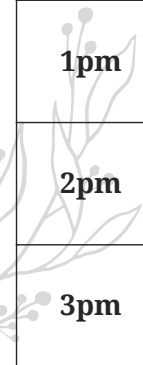
